Dear Parents and Carers,

It has been another week full of opportunities and success for our students and community. Having spent the start of term re-establishing expectations, supporting students to settle into school life and learn our new timetables I am really pleased to see how well so many of our students are now thriving in their learning and relationships with peers. Visiting lessons regularly is a key part of my role in school, offering support and ensuring we are making the right decisions about what we need to do to improve. I have really enjoyed seeing PE, where students were learning the rules of rugby; Year II tutor maths revision all about angles; Year IO maths were students were applying what they had learned to more complex problems and Year 7 English students were really excited about a new unit of learning. I have also been really pleased to see the positive attitude and superb behaviour of Year 9 in their CAT tests this week – although not smiling throughout they did remain positive and resilient.

This week we have started our work with the Jon Egging Trust https://www.joneggingtrust.org.uk/programmes/ to support a group of our Year 8 students. We are really excited to be part of this project and cannot wait to see the impact of this work. Our science team are leading the way in this project and I know they will keep you updated about the progress.




Refurbished Bike Donation:

Attendance:

The Link Between Presence and Progress

We often talk about attendance in terms of percentages, but what those numbers really represent is opportunity.

- Every lesson matters. When a student is absent, they don't just miss a lesson; they miss the key building block for the next. That gap in knowledge grows, and by the time they reach their critical GCSE years, even a seemingly small dip in attendance can have a dramatic impact on their final outcomes.
- The Cost of Absences: A student with 90% attendance misses nearly four full weeks of learning per year. That's a huge disadvantage we simply don't want any of our children to face.

Our core goal is to ensure every student has the best possible pathway to their future, and that pathway starts right here, in every classroom.

We were also fortunate this week to discuss this crucial impact at the Year II Routes to Success evening, demonstrating clearly how attendance directly affects their examination outcomes.


moved into **second place** .

Keep the momentum going—every act of kindness, effort and focus counts. Who's taking the top spot next week? 💪 🙌


Positive points total

Teaching & Learning:

Celebrating Student Work in Our Teaching and Learning Clinic

This week, our staff participated in a productive **Teaching and Learning Clinic**, with a focus on celebrating and enhancing the quality of student work across **King's Academy Brune Park**.

Every teacher brought examples of student books and folders to the clinic. This was a valuable opportunity for all staff to collectively look at the **quality of student work** being produced in different subjects, share best practices, and set clear, high expectations.

Our discussions centred on three key areas:

- 1. **Work Quality:** We reviewed the depth of student understanding and the rigor of the tasks set.
- 2. **Effective Feedback:** We explored various methods for providing timely, specific, and impactful feedback that genuinely helps students improve and take their next steps in learning.
- 3. **Presentation Standards:** We reinforced our commitment to ensuring high standards for the presentation and organisation of work, helping students develop pride and ownership over their learning materials.

The insights gained from reviewing student books are directly feeding into our planning for the coming weeks. We are committed to ensuring every student at Brune Park is challenged, supported, and receives feedback that drives excellence.

Young Minds Fundraiser:

A reminder that King's Academy Brune Park will be taking part in Hello Yellow on Friday 10th October (World Mental Health Day) to raise awareness and funds for YoungMinds, the UK's leading charity for young people's mental health. Year II News:

The Route to Success Evening!

We were so pleased to welcome parents and pupils of Year II to the Route to Success Evening on Thursday.

Year II News:

PPEs:

Pre-public (mock) exams begin on the 13th October for Year II pupils. Pupils should continue to attend revision sessions after school regularly and revise at home. A range of revision materials and exam preparation tasks can be found on the Google Classroom each week. Pupils also have access to the Tassomai app, which is an excellent resource. During the PPEs, pupils will need to come to school each day prepared with the following:

- A copy of their PPE timetable
- 2x black pens, 2x pencils, a rubber, ruler, and a highlighter in a clear pencil case
- A clear water bottle with the labelling removed
- A calculator and Maths kit for Maths, Science, Geography, and any other exam paper where this equipment is required
- Pupils will need to know and remember their candidate number to find their seat in the exam hall
- Pupils are required to be in full school uniform

Please encourage pupils to bring enough lunch and snacks to keep their energy levels up throughout the day during the PPEs. This is so important for concentration levels and their ability to 'keep going' in the afternoon exams. Please encourage your youngsters to have a good sleep pattern during the PPEs, when this is even more important than usual – we know that tiredness can greatly impact examination performance.

Pupils need to arrive at school earlier than normal, every morning throughout the PPE window, starting on the I3th October. Pupils need to be at the Dance Studio for 8.30 am to attend the Pre-Exam Guidance session. Morning exam papers will start promptly at 9 am. For afternoon papers, pupils need to be in the Pre-Exam Guidance session for I.05 pm. Afternoon exam papers will start promptly at I3.30 pm. An overview of the PPE program is available here.

Don't forget to encourage attendance at after school revision sessions. The timetable has been shared via the Google Classroom for Joynson Year and parents via email and an outline of sessions is below.

- If your child is a victim of inappropriate use, the school recommends that you
 report the issue directly to the social media service and the police.
