#### Dear Parents and Carers,

What a week at King's Academy Brune Park! It has been a real privilege to get into so many lessons and interact with students across the school. #### Safeguarding & Mental Health at Brune Park

At King's Academy Brune Park, safeguarding is about creating a culture where every student feels safe, respected and supported. A key part of this is looking after our mental health.

We encourage students to speak openly about how they are feeling and to ask for help when they need it. Our safeguarding and pastoral teams are always available, and every child has trusted adults they can go to for support.

This year we are focusing on:

- Promoting kindness and respect across the school, tackling derogatory language and unkind behaviour.
- Making mental health a priority, students know it is just as important as
  physical health and need to have an awareness of how to self promote their
  own mental health
- Early help. Concerns around wellbeing, attendance, or behaviour are picked up quickly so the right support can be put in place.

If you are ever concerned about your child's wellbeing, please contact their year team or a member of the Safeguarding Team straight away. Together, we can ensure all children in our school feel safe, valued and able to flourish.

#### <u>Safeguarding Reminder: School Gates</u>

As part of our safeguarding culture at King's Academy Brune Park, the school gates are secured each day to ensure the safety of all students.

- Morning: Gates are closed from 8.25am to 8.45am
- Afternoon: Gates are closed from 3.05pm to 3.25pm

During these times, the front of the school is a pedestrian-only zone to keep students safe as they arrive and leave.

This system is already in place and helps us to keep our site safe and secure at the busiest times of the day. Thank you for supporting us in maintaining a safe environment for every child.


#### Positive points:


